

WE LOVE OUR PETS!


Often we consider our pets family members. We enjoy the unconditional love that comes with having pets in our lives.

However, each year countless numbers of pets are overlooked in the confusion of a person's unexpected illness, accident or death. Sometimes after a tragedy strikes, pets are left for days before anyone even realizes they exist.



What can you do to protect your pets?

- Fill out and carry a "Pet Card" in your wallet or purse, such as the one provided with this brochure.
- Prepare a "Pet Document" that contains information about your pets and your wishes. Keep this document with other important papers.
- Find at least two responsible friends, relatives, or neighbors who agree to serve as temporary or possibly permanent emergency caregivers in the event that something unexpected happens.
- Post "In Case of Emergency" notices on your doors to let emergency workers know you have pets inside.
- Talk to your attorney about what estate planning options are available to help provide for your pet in the future and to help formalize your wishes.
