Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

We are a third of the way through our 50th anniversary year, and as we reflect on how far we have come, we are finding many ways to celebrate this major milestone! Most recently, on May 2 we hosted the Tri-County Humane Society 50th Anniversary Celebration Gala. I truly believe people who love animals are among the greatest people in the world. To be surrounded by nearly 200 friends of animals for an entire evening was an absolute treat! More than that, we raised an incredible amount for the animals at the gala (see Page 5)! To those who supported and/or attended our event – thank you for helping make the evening so memorable.

Another reason to celebrate, in April we took in 94 cats who had been removed from a home in Crosby, Minnesota (see Page 7 for the full story). This never would have been possible in our first two shelters, but our current shelter, which opened in 2020, was able to accommodate this large group comfortably. We were grateful to be able to help the cats from Crosby, and while we hope we don't come across a case of this magnitude again, it's a relief to know we have the ability to help if and when there's a need.

The list of reasons to celebrate goes on and on. Beginning in 2011, we've made sure all pets are spayed or neutered prior to adoption, reducing the number of accidental litters in our community. We're also doing more medical

procedures than ever before, such as dentals and heartworm treatment. But perhaps our most notable accomplishment began almost a decade ago: Since 2015, our placement rate has been above 90 percent!

We've come a long way from our humble beginnings in our first shelter, a converted gas station on Lincoln Avenue. But there's one thing that hasn't changed: our commitment to serving the pets and people of Central Minnesota.

As we celebrate all that we have achieved over the past 50 years, we look forward with eager excitement to all that is to come over the next 50 years. Thank you for being a part of our past, our present, and our future! We could not do this work without you!



The Scoop On ... Introducing 2 Cats the Right Way

Editor's Note: This is part two of a three-part series. Look for the last column in the July/ August newsletter.

The second part of our new pet introductions series is all about cats. Even though adopters may be eager and excited to add more cats to their household, our feline friends usually do not feel the same way. The success of a cat adoption relies heavily on proper cat-to-cat introductions.

Know your cat's purr-sonality

As with dogs, cat owners should take into consideration their resident cats' behaviors and general demeanors. Is the cat outgoing and relatively laid back? Is the cat typically timid, hides when guests come over, or displays other signs of stress? Has the cat interacted with other cats in the past?

Both outgoing and timid cats may do well with other cats over time, but the way in which they are introduced and the pacing will need to be adjusted based on their individual personalities.

They'll need some alone time

Separate spaces are a must in the beginning. At minimum, for the first few days (maybe longer) each cat should have its own space and all the resources it needs. Often the easiest way to do this is to put the new cat in a separate room while the resident cat has free roam of the rest of the home. Be sure each cat has a bed, a hiding spot, litter

box, food, water, toys, etc.

Throughout the entire introduction period, be sure to give each cat individual one-on-one time. This could be petting, relaxing or hanging out, interactive playtime, or perhaps brushing. While the cats are getting used to the idea of another cat in the home, continuing to strengthen the bond between each cat and the owner is important.

If all the cats seem relaxed after the first few days of isolation, this is a good time to start indirect interactions. An indirect interaction would be feeding both cats at the same time (ideally high-value items such as wet food or treats) right next to the door on either side. The cats will be able to sense another cat is on the other side of the door, and that will be paired with a positive experience.

Next, swap their scents.
Remove an item such as a blanket or bed from each cat and swap them. This gives the cats the opportunity to smell each other thoroughly before seeing each other.
Repeat indirect interactions like this for at least a few more days before moving on to the next step.

Time to meet—slowly

If all is going well and cats are relaxed, visual introductions are next. Cracking the door to allow them to see each other briefly is a good start. Keep it short. If the cats make eye contact and everyone is relaxed, give a treat and shut the door again. Repeat this many times over a few days to get them more used to seeing one another.

If at any point there is hissing, growling, or other signs of stress and discomfort with the situation, simply stop and try again at a later time. Another approach may be to place both cats in carriers or other restrictedaccess areas so they can see each other without the opportunity to touch. Keep these sessions brief and positive. Do not scold, yell, punish, etc., as that will only make them less comfortable with the situation. Simply stop the interaction and go back to the previous stage.

As you continue to lengthen the time of visual interactions and there are consistent positive results, it may be time to provide supervised direct interactions. In the early stages of direct

contact, continue with short and positive sessions.

Even if it seems like things are going well, it's best to err on the side of caution. Allow them to free roam when supervised, but they should return to separate spaces in the early days of direct interaction when the owner is at work or sleeping.

Patience is crucial during this process

Pet owners will come to understand the specific body language and behaviors of each animal and can gradually flow through the stages of introductions. From start to finish, this process may take as little as 1-2 weeks, or it could take several months. The key is patience to allow everyone adequate time and space to adjust. Seek help and guidance from TCHS staff whenever needed!

Community Supports TCHS In Wake of Crosby Cat Case

Tri-County Humane Society was contacted by the Minnesota Federated Humane Societies in late March, asking us if we would have space for a large number of cats. They were working on a case in Crosby, Minnesota. We had an abnormally low numbers of cats in our shelter at that time, so we agreed to help.

On April 11, the Crosby Police Department with the assistance of the Minnesota **Federated Humane Societies** began removing the cats from the Crosby home. They found 102 cats, 94 of which were brought to Tri-County Humane Society at 5:30 p.m. About a dozen of our dedicated staff stayed until 11 p.m. doing their intakes.

Unlikely reunions

During our intakes, we scanned them for microchips, and one of the cats had one! We contacted the owners, and they drove immediately from Crosby to be reunited with their cat. It had been missing for seven years.

On April 12, the Crosby Police Department issued a news release that said, "Anyone missing cats in the area is encouraged to contact the Tri-County Humane society." We decided to treat all of the cats as strays to give people a chance to see if their lost cat was among the group.

On April 13, a couple from Sartell reached out to us and said they thought one of the cats on our website looked a

lot like their lost cat. Their cat, a 10-year-old neutered feline named Cougar, had unique markings, and there was a neutered cat whom we had guessed to be 10 years old with identical markings on our website. We invited them to come in and take a look. It was their cat, who had been missing for six months to the day. By chance, KARE 11 was at our shelter interviewing us about the Crosby cats when the Sartell couple showed up.

A compelling story

We also received visits from WCCO, KSTP, and Fox 9, we were aired on the MPR morning show, WJON, KNSI, and seven stations in the Brainerd Lakes area, and we were featured in the Star Tribune, St. Cloud Times, St. Cloud Live, the Newslead-

er, even a paper in New York picked up the story! Thanks to the attention from media and our devout social media followers, over the course of the five days we received over 200 emails from people hoping we had their lost cat. Sadly, we did not find any other matches.

cats in foster care or being treated in-house who are not ready to be released yet, but we have successfully adopted out 30 Crosby cats to date, and we have many ready and waiting for adoption. Our amazing staff and volunteers have gone above and beyond to make sure these cats receive the love and care that they need. In our 50 years, this is by far the largest group of animals we have taken in at one

We are touched by the outpouring of support for these cats. There are too many donors—literally hundreds — to list them all, but we want everyone to know we are so grateful.
